Japanese Language	Junya Ishihara Associate Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Phonetics and Phonology in Japanese This lecture shows the variation and distribution of the speech sounds and some of the rules they follow in the Japanese language.
	Kumiko Sakoda Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Japanese Communication: From Understanding to Doing - Second Language Acquisition Studies for Improving Japanese Students will learn the difference between "understanding" and "being able to", and develop their Japanese language skills through various communicative tasks.
	Nobuharu Sato Professor (Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences)	The Japanese You Don't Learn at School This course covers Japanese expressions that are useful to know.
	Seiji Nashio Lecturer (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Japanese Particles A comprehensive review of grammar that will help students advance their Japanese. In this course we will logically review the types of particles and their relationship to sentence structure.
	Kanetaka Hukami Associate Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Passives and Causatives in Modern Japanese This course aims to explain the characteristics of modern Japanese, focusing on the structures and meanings of passive and causative sentences.
	Yoshichika Honda Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Everyday Japanese In this course we will take a look at some Japanese expressions that are often used in daily life.
	Yoshichika Honda Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Counting in Japanese There are many expressions used when counting in Japanese. In this course we will take a closer look at some of the most commonly used ones.
	Daichi Yanamoto Lecturer (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Japanese Language Learning and Cognitive Psychology In learning Japanese, we memorize words, understand their meanings, and output our thoughts in a second language. This course will introduce research in cognitive psychology that sheds light on the phenomena that occur during these linguistic activities. We will also introduce learning methods based on what we know from these studies, and have students practice them in class.
Hiroshi Arami Professor (Graduate School of Humanities and Social Sciences)	The History and Culture of World Heritage Site Miyajima Let's learn about the history and culture of Miyajima from the perspective of the "Island of the Gods" as a preliminary course before the World Heritage Site Miyajima - History and Culture Study Trip.	
Asami Ogura Lecturer (Kure National College of Technology)	Furoshiki and Japanese Life This course will introduce the origins of Furoshiki and the lifestyle of the Edo period, when it was first used, thereby explaining the importance of effective use of resources. We will also cover the meaning behind the colors and patterns of Furoshiki, and students will have the opportunity to try wrapping a Furoshiki themselves.	

Japanese Culture	Susumu Kanata Professor Emeritus (Hiroshima University)	Japanese Paintings: The World of Emaki Scrolls In the first part of this course we will consider the significance of aesthetics, a discipline born in 18th century Europe, in the modern context. In the second part we will study the Chōjū giga (Scroll of Frolicking Animals), the origin of anime and manga, which today are synonymous with "Cool Japan".
	Hidemichi Kawanishi Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Questioning Japanese History Japanese history is not a single, homogeneous thing. In this course we will think about it from a variety of perspectives.
	Michio Komiyama Associate Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	The Atomic Bomb and Hiroshima as a Peace Memorial City Students will learn about the damage caused by the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and the construction of Hiroshima as a Peace Memorial City before visiting it as part of the Hiroshima City - History, Culture and Peace Study Trip.
	Michio Komiyama Associate Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Japanese Names and History This course will cover the history of Japanese names, how they work, their characteristics, and what makes them interesting. Students are encouraged to think about their own names while learning about Japanese ones.
	Norio Shimizu Associate Professor (Hiroshima University Museum)	Higashihiroshima City Flora and Fauna: From Wildlife on Campus to the Japanese Giant Salamander, a Special Natural Treasure Students will be introduced to the ecology, environment and conservation ideas surrounding not only the familiar plants and animals that live on campus, but also the Japanese giant salamander, the world's largest amphibian endemic to Japan.
	Shizuyo Harley Nippon Origami Association Certified Instructor	The Culture of Origami Most people know the famous folded paper crane, but in this course we will experience origami in a slightly different way by making a type of origami that is unique to the season.
	Yuko Matsuyama Assistant Professor (Morito Institute of Global Higher Education)	Japanese Literature and Art Students will learn about Japanese literature, and art that is closely related to Japanese literature. In particular, we will focus on the cultural spread of hiragana and waka poetry and scrolls containing writing and illustrations.
	Takao Momo Former Executive Director of the Hiroshima International Animation Festival (Currently at Hiroshima Electric Railway)	Fundamentals of Japanese Animation Anime represents modern Japanese culture and shapes how the world sees Japan. In this course, we will learn how to understand anime culture analytically and comprehensively by discussing the anime industry, the history of anime and the structural analysis of anime creations from three viewpoints.
	Kazuhiko Watanabe Professor Emeritus (Hiroshima University)	Traditional Japanese Sports and Rei: From Bujutsu to Budo Judo, Kendo and Karate-do all have one thing in common - "do". As do the two other representative forms of Japanese culture, flower arrangement (kado), and calligraphy (shodo). This course will explain the manners of Japanese people from the perspective of sports and "rei".
